Then consider the School Direct teacher training programme with Warren Junior Teaching School, a network of schools led by Warren Junior School including the Outstanding Trinity Special School* in Barking and Dagenham, in alliance with Goldsmiths University London. We will work to support you through the programme and provide you with opportunities to secure employment at the end of the course.

All Trainees must have GCSE Grade C or above (or an equivalency test) in English, Maths and Science before training begins and a degree, class 2.1 or better. Overseas graduates must produce a letter from UK NARIC. You will need to pass skills tests in English and mathematics before starting the course.

Warren Junior Teaching School comprises of schools that span the age ranges of Early Years Settings, Primary Schools and a Special School. We are an inclusive alliance with specialist provision for children with autism, we offer behaviour support and the facilities for teaching of the deaf. We have the capacity to offer high quality support for teachers and leaders at all stages in their career.

***Trinity Special School:**

Placements at Trinity Special School will provide trainees with additional pedagogy for SEND, the second school placement in the spring term will be in a mainstream school.

We are delighted to offer **School Direct Salaried and Non-Salaried Programmes:**

School Direct Salaried: Code 2Q3G

This route offers a school based training model accredited by Goldsmiths University. You will be trained, mentored and coached by highly experienced classroom practitioners, supported by University study and university-based mentors. The course has a strong focus on pedagogical understanding. Eligible candidates must have a minimum of three years of paid employment but may be a 'career changer' but now wishes to join the teaching profession. The trainee teacher is employed by one of the schools within the alliance throughout the training year. This is a postgraduate programme and a Professional Graduate Certificate in Education (PGCE) will be awarded by Goldsmiths University.



School Direct Non-Salaried: Code 2Q2Y

This route also offers a school based training model accredited by Goldsmiths University. You will be trained, mentored and coached by highly experienced classroom practitioners, supported by University study and university-based mentors. The course has a strong focus on pedagogical understanding and is specifically designed for trainees who have not had experience of full time paid employment but wishes to join the teaching profession. This is a postgraduate programme and a Professional Graduate Certificate in Education (PGCE) will be awarded by Goldsmiths University.

To apply follow these steps:

- Apply for a place on the School Direct Salaried /Non-Salaried programme by visiting www.ucas.com/apply/teacher-training - 2. 'Find a programme' – 'Starting in 2016'
- Search/Select **Warren Junior School** Code: 27K and follow the instructions in order to register and apply to the programme, ensuring you select the salaried/non-salaried Primary route you wish to apply for.
- You will be issued with a reference number which will enable you to book your skills tests.
- Book your skills tests and sit them within 2 working weeks of applying for the programme.
- Your application will be sent by UCAS to Warren Junior School and interview arrangements will be made for those successfully selected applicants.
- There is no closing date for applications; we will continue to review applications until the course is full.
