

Sequencing and Telling Stories

Sequencing and telling stories is really helpful for your child learning the order in which things happen, and can be helpful in terms of both developing their understanding and developing their expressive language.

There are easy ways of building this into your day:

- Take pictures of what you have done on your phone and look through these at the end of the day. Talk about these and what you did.
- Look through a book and talk about what is happening. Your child could retell the story using words or by pointing to the pictures.
- Take pictures of a sequence e.g. making a sandwich, pouring a drink, blowing bubbles. Look through these on your phone. Ask your child to find the first or last step.

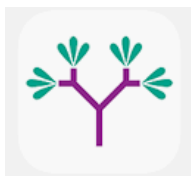
